



Resolution adopted by the General Assembly on 8 May 2020

**United Nations peacekeeping and peacebuilding. Importance of
global ceasefire for humanitarian aid delivery and
migration**

The General Assembly,

Reminding that the numbers of people being refugees and migrants because of several world security and economy issues,

Reaffirming the significance and importance of global communication and cooperation for peacekeeping and peacebuilding,

Noting with satisfaction the past efforts of various relevant UN bodies and nongovernmental organizations to provide support for countries with low-economic growth,

Stressing the fact that the United Nations faces significant obstacles and is in need of reform, particularly in the humanitarian realm,

Bearing in mind the right to peace,

Taking note of the commitment of the Secretary-General to support the peacekeeping and peacebuilding in the United Nations,

Recalling the resolution S/RES/2518 of Security Council on improving the safety and security of peacekeepers approved on 30 March 2020,

Recalling the resolution 26 April 2018S/RES/2413 of General Assembly on decision to invite relevant UN bodies and organs to further consider the recommendations and options in the Secretary-General's implementation report on peacebuilding and sustaining peace,

1. **Call** countries with high economic growth to be active on providing financial support to the countries having high number refugees in their country

2. **Recommend** all the nations to bolster their international relations and cooperation in a positive way by keeping actions on sending humanitarian aids to the countries;

3. **Call** all the nations to be more helpful on providing support to refugees and migrants;

4. **Call upon** all the nations with high number of refugees to be more respective and supportive to the migrants and refugees by creating social distancing facilities, building shelter towns with mobile medical hospitals and providing with medicines and provision;

5. **Further invite** countries with high-economic growth to be more active on funding UN peacekeeping missions

6. **Recommend** to introduce new medical standards to preserve the right of every peacekeeper and make everything possible to protect people from COVID-19;

7. **Highly recommend** to create refugee adaptation programs and **call** to simplify employment procedures for migrants and refugees, offering decent salary, as well as support their education by various educational programs;

8. **Call** to allocate a separate block of social assistance for refugees and provide them social guarantees;

9. **Recommend** to create a fund under the UN with online site for donations, which will be responsible for gathering contributions from countries with high economy growth to support countries with low economy growth;

10. **Urges** all police-contributing countries to meet UN performance standards for personnel, training, and equipping,

11. **Support** the effective implementation of mandated tasks while maintaining the highest standards of conduct,

12. **Further urge** all civilian mission components and Secretariat staff supporting peacekeeping operations to meet performance standards and comply with staff regulations.
